Numbers, decimals, fractions and ratio, algebra and geometry <u>Students going into Grade 7</u>

Algebra, functions and equations, fractions, and ratio, geometry

<u>Students going into Grade 8</u>

Index Laws, measurement, ratios and proportions, equations, trigonometry

Writers Workshop: Individuals will have the opportunity to hone their writing craft - developing themes, plots, characters, settings, as well as conflict and resolution. We will work with genres like those used in the Book Club. The workshop incorporates elements of information literacy, research, formatting, style, and grammar. This is a great opportunity to get down on paper all those thoughts floating about in your brain. Students will explore their writing on the three weekly themes according to their grade levels. In the 3rd week, students will also explore writing their own autobiography!

Scratch Programming

This course will introduce students to the wonderful world of programming. Students will learn the basics of programming through fun projects. This course is designed for students in grades 6, 7, and 8. It is not expected that students have prior knowledge of programming

What to bring:

1. A pair of indoor shoes on Mondays. Students can leave them here

for the week and take them home on Fridays to clean.

- 2. A notebook with the record of the body temperature taken each morning. This will be checked at the door every morning.
- 3. Writing utensils.
- 4. Packed lunch
- 5. Bottled water
- 6. A **mouth cover**: a plastic mouth cover will be given to each student on the first day of summer school. Please wash it every evening and bring it back to school the next morning for your child to wear.) Students also have a choice to wear a mask if they prefer.
- 7. Books for the Book Club and notebooks will be given by Little Brown.
- 8. We also recommend for students to carry a personal thermometer in case we need to check his/her temperature.

Rules and Regulations for summer school during Covid19 time.

- 1. Check your child's body temperature every morning. If the temperature runs 37.5 or higher, keep your child at home and notify us.
- 2. If your child has a cold like symptoms such as sneezing, coughing, and runny nose, keep your child at home and notify us.
- 3. In case a student shows a cold like symptoms at school, he/she will be sent home and parents will be notified.
- 4. If a student has a temperature 37.5 or higher, he/she will be sent home and parents will be notified.
- 5. A plastic mouth cover will be given to each student on the first day of summer school. Students will take personal care to keep it clean and are required to wear it in class.
- 6. Please refrain your children from excessive social activities after school and over the weekend during summer school. Keep them on schedule for school, rest and sleep to help make this summer school successful.
